<p>English: Reading Comprehension: read through the text provided and answer the questions about it. Make sure you answer in full sentences with as much detail as you can.</p>	<p>Maths: Maths Challenge! Learning Opportunities: Choose <i>at least 3</i> activities		
<p>Design Technology: We will be learning about why the Romans invaded Britain. Research how the Romans used their shields in battle or how the Britons used their chariots during the invasion. Design and make your own shield or chariot. You could draw it or make it using modelling materials.</p>  	<p>Geography: Rome offers amazing sites and tourist attractions. Imagine you are on holiday in Rome. Write a postcard home describing the tourist attractions you have been to. Were they ancient or modern? Where do you plan to visit tomorrow?</p> 	<p>Music: Learn the song 'Just Like a Roman!' and maybe even create your own dance moves to show what the Romans got up to. The words and music are on Seesaw, so have a go and have some fun with it!</p> 
<p>Science: This term we will be learning all about sound! Take a walk (indoors or outdoors) and write down what different sounds you can hear. Try and describe them. Are the sounds loud or quiet? What is the loudest sound you can hear? What is the quietest? What is vibrating to cause the sound? Present your findings in an interesting way, such as in a table, a poster or a presentation.</p> 	<p>History/ Religious Education: In early Roman times, the Romans believed in many different gods and goddesses, who they believed controlled different aspects of their lives. Research the Roman Gods and Goddesses and create a fact file on at least one. You might include why the Romans believed in a number of Gods rather than just one.</p> 	<p>Art: Many of Rome's famous buildings have beautiful mosaic flooring, showing different patterns and scenes from their history. Create your own mini mosaic. You can use pencils, paints, ripped paper or any other craft materials. What pattern will you make?</p>
